



UFR: "Unité de Formation et de Recherche" or "Composante" (or Faculty) is a subdivision of the university that groups together different departments in the same field (for example, the UFR 1 includes the departments of Cinema, Theater, Fine arts, Literature, Humanities, Music, Philosophy). Our university includes 6 UFRs and 1 institute (ITIC).

Most departments have the same website structure. Following this document will help you navigate through the UPVM website to find info on our 6 UFRs and Institute (ITIC).

#### Here are pointers to help you find what you need

Fascicule: usually, fascicules contain course description, course composition and

timetables

**Emploi du temps**: timetables

**Descriptif**: course description

Maquette: overview of each semester (code, title, time volume, composition and

number of ECTS of a course)

**Plaquette**: could also contain the course description

#### How to Find a Course?


**LLCER** (*Littératures et Civilisation Étrangères et Régionales*) is a department that offers a training that specializes in the study of a modern language.

# How to understand the French Course and Degree Structure?

- The Licence (equivalent Bachelor's Degree) consists of 6 semesters of 30 ECTS for a total of 180 ECTS.
- The Master's degree consists of 4 semesters of 30 ECTS for a total of 120 ECTS.
- A French university semester is composed of blocks of courses called UEs (Unités d'Enseignement).
- These blocks are, most of the time, divided into ECUEs (Éléments Constitutifs d'une Unité d'enseignement).
- These ECUEs, on the other hand, may consist of several parts (CM, TD, TP). If a course is composed of several parts, then all these teachings must be taken. It is not possible to take only a part of it. It is the grade obtained as a whole that will be transferred to your home university.
  - It is therefore crucial to identify the right code for the right course.



# **How to Read a Course Code?**

The code for a *Licence* course taught during the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of the 1<sup>st</sup> year will begin with U1 or UE (and be followed by other numbers that reflect the particular branch of the discipline and by letters that reflect the Departments)

The code for a *Licence* course taught during the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year will begin with U6 or E6.

#### For instance:

**E41PS5** will be a course given in the Dept of Psychology (PS) during the 2nd semester of the 2nd year (4).
